

Who We Are SIDNEY STRINGER MULTI ACADEMY TRUST

Sidney Stringer opened as an Academy in September 2010. Academies are state funded schools that provide a free education for pupils of all abilities and are independent of the local authority.

In 2014 the Sidney Stringer Multi Academy Trust was formed and involved Radford primary Academy and Ernesford Grange community Academy all working together with the goal of all three schools becoming outstanding.

Sidney Stringer Academy caters for 1350 students aged 11-19 including a large sixth form. We are a happy and successful school delivering the very highest standards of education. We have a reputation of meeting the needs of all of our pupils and supporting the students to make outstanding progress.

In September 2014 Sidney stringer was designated by the National Teaching and Leadership College as a Teaching School. This means that we have an important role in raising standards

and take a lead in the recruitment and training of new entrants to the profession, identifying leadership potential and providing support for other schools.

There is a high commitment to using new technology to raise standards. We work closely with Apple to offer high quality training to staff as well as supporting other schools regionally. The school has excellent ICT facilities and most of our students have IPADS as well as easy access to computers before and after school.

Courses, learning and assessments are organised to best meet the needs and aspirations of the individual student. Our curriculum develops the student as a whole person.



OUR APPROACH TOWARDS EDUCATION PROVIDES A RICH, PERSONALISED CURRICULUM THAT CATERS FOR STUDENTS OF ALL BACKGROUNDS AND ABILITIES.

On leaving the Academy we want each student to be able to lead a team and be a team member, demonstrate initiative and be enterprising, and be ready and willing to make a contribution to their communities.

Students are offered an unparralled range of subjects with option choices starting in Year 9. Digital projectors, interactive whiteboards, wireless laptops and iPads are used in every classroom. Students have access to computers and iPads to continue their learning independently outside of lessons. We have also recently become an Apple Regional Training Centre. Resources and facilities are cutting edge.

Sidney Stringer Academy has become the first state school or Academy in Coventry to collect a social media award. Henry Plattern range of opportunities for applied learning. from eTreble9.com said:

A Supportive

Each student in Years 7 to 11 is a member of one of five mixed-age Houses. Our Vertical Tutoring system allows students to work together to develop tolerance, trust and empathy.

Younger students are helped, guided and inspired by older students. Older students develop important leadership and social skills.

Mixed-age tutor groups are led by a Househead with a team of tutors/mentors who work with parents and carers. They monitor progress, provide personal support, encourage high achievement and challenge underachievement.

Each of our tutor groups is led by a tutor and co-tutor with no more than 20 students in any group.

Sidney Stringer Academy is an inclusive school which admits students with disabilities and special needs on an equal basis with other students. The Academy has lifts, access ramps and wheelchair facilities. All students have access to the full curriculum and all facilities.

We have a large, skilled, experienced learning support team, an educational psychologist and Family Outreach team to support students. We work in partnership with parents and carers who are kept closely informed about students' progress. The Academy works in accordance with the SEN Code of Practice and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State relating to section 316 and 316 A of the 1996 Education Act.

Students learning English as a new language receive specialist support to enable rapid integration into the life of the Academy and its curriculum.




